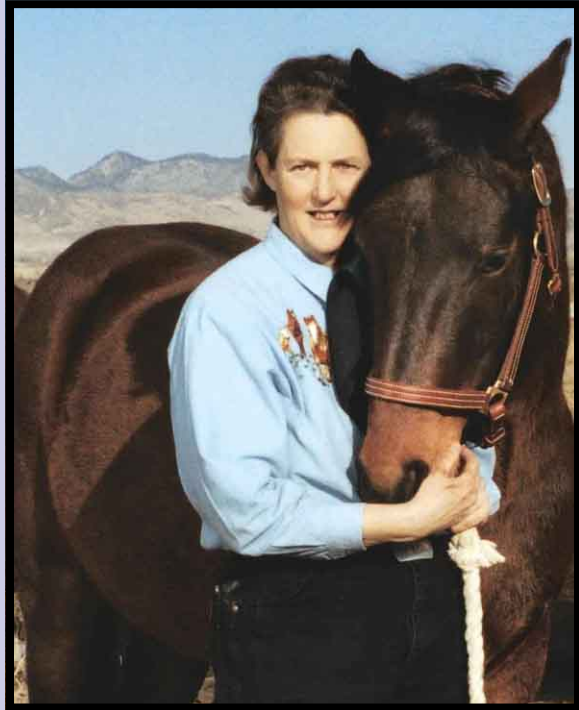


THE CARL L. BECKER HOUSE WELCOMES

Temple Grandin first encountered cows on a trip to a cattle ranch when she was a teenager and realized that they experience the world in many of the same ways that she did.

Combining her remarkable ability to create building designs inside her head and her cow's eye view of the world, she became the foremost designer of humane animal facilities in the U.S. She persuaded fast food chains like McDonald's to adopt her standards in the humane treatment of animals and spurred a revolution in the American meat industry.

Dr. Grandin is currently a leader of both the animal welfare and autism advocacy movements. Both movements commonly cite her work regarding animal welfare, neurology, and philosophy.
