



# Jane Hammond

Jane Hammond graduated from Mount Holyoke College in 1972 and went on to receive her MFA from the University of Madison-Wisconsin. She is a renowned

artist whose works reflect her lifelong fascination with collecting, sorting, and memory. Along the way, she invented her own visual language, based on 276 images borrowed from books on everything from puppetry to beekeeping. She has described her intricate collage style as a “semiotic genome project,” underscoring



the endlessly varied interactions between image and viewer. Her works



have been acquired by more than 70 museums around the world, such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Art Institute of Chicago and the Museum of Modern Art. Hammond’s current exhibition, *Paperwork*, will be held at the Johnson Museum Jan. 19 - Mar. 23.
